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ART NEWSLETTER!

Hello!

I would like to start by formally introducing myself! My name is Danielle Burrows and I am the art teacher here at St. Matthias! I started at St. Matthias last November in the middle of virtual learning - something I never thought I would be doing during my first year of teaching! I'm at St. Matthias full time this year and couldn't be more thankful! I love working with your children and they have all taught me so much - not only about myself, but also the world around me!

If you ever need to get a hold of me, my school email is dburrows@stmatthiasmilw.org. I do not work on the weekends or evenings after 4, so please allow for a 24-48 hour time frame for a response. Below are the days your child has art class and a description of what they are working on in the upcoming weeks! If it is at all possible, please try to have them dress in darker clothes these days to avoid stains on lighter clothing. In the event that we are working with cloth staining materials, smocks will be worn.

K4/K5:

K4 has art on Mondays and Thursdays K5 has art on Wednesday and Thursdays

The K4/K5 students have been working on exploring new art materials while also learning about different colors and shapes. They have mastered how to use their scissors, glue sticks, liquid glue bottles, markers, and much more! They worked so hard on creating "shape monsters" that represented these new found skills. K5 finished a little earlier than K4 so they got to explore watercolor paints as well.

1st & 2nd:

Both 1st & 2nd have art on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays

1st and 2nd graders have been working so hard on color theory! The last few weeks we have been working on identifying the differences between primary and secondary colors, intermediate and analogous colors, as well as complimentary colors. They are just finishing up their "color wheel sunflowers" this week and will be starting crayon and leaf rubbings next week!

3rd-5th:

3rd has art on Wednesdays and Fridays 4th has art on Monday and Fridays 5th has art on Tuesdays and Fridays

The 3rd-5th grades just finished up working on their "about me" collage sculpture boxes. These boxes are supposed to act as a safe space for the kids to store their art work in at home. They worked so hard on this project and I was totally blown away with their creativity! We are now currently working on learning about the elements of art and will be creating projects in response to those elements (shape, line form, texture, value, color, space).



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6th-8th:

6th has art on Monday and Thursdays 7th and 8th have art on Tuesday and Wednesdays

The 6-8th graders also just finished up working on their "about me" collage sculpture boxes. Again, these boxes are supposed to act as a safe space for the kids to store their art work in at home. I made one of these growing up and still have it under my bed at home! We are now transitioning into a new unit that focuses on healing through the natural world. This unit was created this summer at a workshop I did at Lynden Sculpture Garden in Fox Point. I worked with 20+ local art educators in MPS as well as world renowned artist Daniel Minter to create this project. Students will learn how to deal with real life issues and emotions through art and nature. They will also be exploring their own personal identity, and how that is connected with nature. They will get to work with printmaking materials and will be creating their own stamp in response to a nature walk we will be doing on the school's campus!
