6th-8th Grade PLTW News Sept. Oct. 2023

As we approach the midpoint of our first trimester, our 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students have been working hard in class. A brief update for each level is as follows...

6th Grade- 6th graders have been studying what an engineer is and have investigated many different types of engineers. Students chose a specific engineering career that intrigued them and then researched specific aspects of it including what the job entails, what education is needed, what salary can be attained, and where the engineer works- just to name a few. Completed reports can be viewed in the lower hallway of the 62 building opposite the restrooms.

Currently, the class is in a unit that I call the "Skimmer" unit. Here we learn about drag and friction and how these two forces can affect the movement of an object both positively and negatively. Students are in the process of building a device that, when properly made with attention to detail and the reduction of drag and force, will effortlessly "skim" across the gym floor on a cushion of air. A fun competition will be a part of the activity as well.



When this unit is completed in a few weeks we will move ahead and learn about the history of measurement (ancient and modern), how to use different measuring devices such as calipers, and how to measure in both standard and metric units. Measurement, that is accurate measurement, is a must in engineering!

7th grade- 7th graders have been working with the Design Process (identify the problem, brainstorm ideas to solve the problem, choose one solution, build a prototype and test it, present the solution to an audience). The students were asked to identify a problem that they encountered with the wearing of masks during the covid outbreak and come up with a mask design to address it- many clever ideas came to light and students created posters on their designs. The posters can be viewed in the 62 building hallway.



Recently the students were challenged to solve a problem that has been encountered in Mr. Heinzen's "man cave". It seems that Mrs. Heinzen is not happy with the mess left by him and his friends after the weekly Packer game and has threatened to turn the man cave into a sewing room if things do not change. Students are designing devices to solve this problem as we speak.

Next up is the exploration of what Iteration is and how the design process is modified to create new and improved products through time.

8th grade- Finally, our 8th grade class has been busy learning about robots in our society (how they are a help, how they influence life, do they take jobs away, what concerns you about robots), the numerous categories of robots, and researching a specific real-world robot type.



In the next few weeks the students will learn to program a real robot (a Sphero Spark+ robot) to complete and solve numerous challenges using block-coding and wifi connections.

Next up we will explore various aspects of mechanisms including gears, speed, building 10 different mechanisms using the "VEX" system, as well as the design and building of a "pull toy".
