

St. Matthias Mission Statement

St. Matthias Catholic Parish is committed to continuing the ministry of Jesus Christ. We invite and welcome all. Come... live, grow, and be challenged by the message through prayer, formation, and service.

High School Christian Formation Program Description

The St. Matthias High School Christian Formation Program is designed to show high school young people what being a Catholic looks like in today's world. Young people in each grade level will be introduced and mentored to practice and develop a lifestyle of habitual actions that promote discipleship. Some of these are, but are not limited to: prayer, conscience formation, active participation in liturgical celebrations, growth in relationship with Jesus, reading and interpreting Scripture, leadership opportunities, and service to the world. This is accomplished through relational ministry of young people together in both large and small group activities.



Young people who are starting their junior year of high school can also begin immediate preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation, in which the above habits described above will be pursued and encouraged in more detail.



Requirements for the Confirmation Program:

What follows are the specific requirements for young people in immediate preparation for Confirmation. General policies for Christian Formation can be found in the High School Christian Formation Parent/Student Handbook.

Sponsor

1. Each candidate will select a Confirmation sponsor. Sponsors must be at least 16 years old, a confirmed and actively practicing Catholic, and not the candidate's parents.
2. Once a sponsor is chosen, the candidate will complete a sponsor form and submit it no later than Sunday December 11th, 2022. (Please see attached form "Confirmation Sponsor Agreement")
3. If you are having issues or trouble locating a sponsor you may call, Brian Jens, Director of Youth & Adult Ministries at 414-982-2406, but only as a last resort.

Confirmation Name

1. Candidates may choose to select an additional name to serve as their Confirmation name. These names are used as an introduction to the Archbishop/Bishop.
2. Typically, Confirmation names are picked after a saint. However other names can be selected for various reasons.
3. Candidates will begin the process of choosing a name at the session on Sunday November 13th, 2021. At this session, they will learn about the saints and will be told about the process of picking a Confirmation name. Once chosen, the candidate must fill out the Confirmation Name Worksheet at the back of this packet and submit it to the Director of Youth & Adult Ministries by Sunday March 12th, 2022.
4. Candidates who miss the session in March will be responsible for handing in the information on time.

Student/Sponsor Activities

1. Candidates will complete three activities with their sponsor. These activities will require the candidate and their sponsor to meet and discuss different topics. All activities should be done in person unless the person lives too far away.
2. Descriptions for each assignment can be found on page 6.

Retreat

1. Candidates will participate in an day retreat in preparation for Confirmation. The retreat will be held on Sunday February 5th, 2023, either at St. Matthias or at a location still to be determined. The retreat will last from 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM.

2. If the candidate cannot attend our retreat, they need to alert the Director of Youth & Adult Ministries and arrange to attend a retreat with a different parish as soon as possible! Please be diligent in looking at the dates ahead of time.
3. A retreat packet will be mailed out at the end of October with the permission slips. If you do not receive the packet please call Brian Jens at the Parish Office.

Candidate Questionnaire for the Reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation

1. At the session on February 19th, 2023, candidates will be told how to fill out the questionnaire for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation. It is a fillable PDF on the website that can be completed, saved, and printed.
2. The questionnaire is the candidate's official way of asking the bishop to confirm.
3. The questionnaire must be turned in by Sunday March 12th, 2022. The questionnaire must be completed prior to Confirmation. Candidates must take full responsibility of receiving the assignment, completing it, and turning it in. Make separate arrangements if you cannot make it to either the day the assignment comes out or needs to be turned in.

Staff Interview

1. Candidates will participate in an exit interview with a member of the parish staff any time after the retreat concludes.
2. The interview is an opportunity for students to pause and reflect on their formation experience and on where their path towards deepening their faith is going. Candidates will be responsible for contacting their assigned staff member to set up the interview.
3. Assignments will be given to the candidates at their session on Sunday February 19th, 2023. The interview must be completed *before* the end of the day on 5/5/2023.

Baptismal Certificate

1. Before any person receives a sacrament, a baptismal certificate must be on file for that person. If your child was not baptized at St. Matthias, you must request a new baptismal certificate to be sent from that parish to St. Matthias.
2. To request a certificate, call the parish office of the parish in which your child was baptized. Ask the person who answers to send a baptismal certificate to St. Matthias: Attn: Brian Jens, 9306 W Beloit Rd, Milwaukee, WI 53227.
3. If you were baptized at St. Matthias, you do not need to do anything as we already have your baptismal information.



Misc.

1. Weekend Mass is the cornerstone to the development of the candidate's faith and will aid them well along their journey. Candidates are asked to attend Mass every weekend.
2. **Candidates will make a commitment and receive a blessing as they begin the Confirmation process. This blessing will be held on Sunday, November 13th, 2022, at the 10 am Mass.**
3. Formal dress is required for the day of Confirmation. This would mean shirts and ties for gentlemen and appropriate formal dress wear for ladies. Please take modesty into consideration when selecting attire

****Candidates are asked to enter the Confirmation process with an open mind and heart.
The decision to be confirmed belongs to the youth. ****

Frequently Asked Questions About Confirmation

1. May parents be sponsors?

Parents may not act as sponsors (c. 874). While parents are not to serve as sponsors, their role in the faith development of their children is not to be underplayed or minimized.

2. May someone who cannot be present be a sponsor and someone else fill in as proxy?

Yes. However, it is recommended that someone nearby be chosen as the sponsor so that she or he can become more intimately involved in the candidate's preparation.

3. What qualifies an individual as a sponsor?

To be admitted to the role of sponsor, a person must:

- Be designated by the one to be confirmed
- Be 16 years old
- Be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has received the sacrament of Eucharist and leads a life in harmony with the faith and role to be undertaken
- Not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared
- Not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (c. 874).



4. Is a confirmation retreat required?

The retreat is integral to a candidate's preparation and is not to be omitted without serious reason.

5. If a candidate is unable to be confirmed at his/her parish on the date that is scheduled, may she or he be confirmed at another parish?

Yes, this should be worked out between the pastors or parish directors of both parishes.

6. To what extent do Catholic high school students need to be involved in their confirmation program?

Catholic high school students should be encouraged to share the gift of their Catholic education with others, and they need to be included as part of the confirmation group. However, they are not expected to repeat everything they have learned in their daily religion classes. Retreats and service projects offered by Catholic high schools can be integrated into the confirmation program.

Student/Sponsor Activities

Going to Mass – Experience the Universal Church

You and your sponsor must attend **2 Masses together**. One at St. Matthias and the other at the parish of your sponsor. If your sponsor also belongs to St. Matthias choose another parish in your neighborhood. If your sponsor lives out of state or far enough away where this becomes difficult, talk to your sponsor about a specific weekend where both of you will be at Mass. Then talk about the experiences afterwards. After attending the Masses, you will answer some reflection questions online. This needs to be completed before the last session **Sunday April 16th, 2023**.

Service Experience

You and your sponsor must engage in a service activity **together for a minimum of 2 hours, which both the candidate and sponsor choose together, but the candidate takes the initiative to set up the project**. If your sponsor is out of state or far enough away where this becomes difficult, talk with your sponsor about a specific activity you counted towards your service experiences. After you completed your service experience you will complete an online reflection. This needs to be completed in before the last session **Sunday April 16th, 2023**.

Interview People of Faith

The best way to understand what it means to be Catholic is to talk with people who live their Catholic faith. Throughout the year you will need to interview 2 people (1 being your sponsor and the other a random person) of why they are Catholic and why their faith is important to them. After interviewing them you will answer some reflection questions online. If your sponsor lives far away, please find a time to meet over the phone or virtually to talk. This needs to be completed in before the last session **Sunday April 16th, 2023**.

Confirmation Name Worksheet

Choosing A Confirmation Name – When you are confirmed your sponsor will “present” you to the bishop by a name, other than your first name. This is your “Confirmation Name.” Choosing a Confirmation name is an important part of the sacramental process as it helps you to discover how the Catholic Church is really a “communion of saints.” Furthermore, it will help you to see the many different ways to live out your faith, and hopefully provide you with another role model. **Your Confirmation Name is Due Sunday March 12th, 2023.**

Things to Keep in Mind:

- Confirmation Name should *preferably* be the name of a saint. If you would like to take the name in honor someone important in your life (parent, sponsor, godparent, etc.) you can, but first check to see if it is the name of a saint. If not, check with Brian Jens.
- You may take your baptismal name (middle name) as your saint name. However, you still must do research on who that saint is, and why it is you choose that name.
- The bishop will ask you, “Why did you choose that name?” Be prepared to answer. Write down and be ready to say 3-5 things about your name. The bishop looks at your names, learns their lives, and will know whether you are telling the truth.

Definition of Patron Saints – Meanings and Origins – Patron Saints are those holy and virtuous men and women who are considered to be a defender of a specific group of people or a nation.

There is a patron for virtually every cause, profession or special interest.
